S **be going to** **V**

We use

be going to V

when we have already decided
to do something in the future.

We have planned it.

- Why are you learning English?

I've decided

- I am going to study (study) abroad.

We also use

***be going to* V**

to make predictions
about the future.

We can see evidence in the present.
