



Improving pronunciation by listening to songs











Singing also helps us learn how stronger and weaker sounds are pronounced differently in English.




So, if you are ready, let me introduce you several steps how you can improve your pronunciation by listening to songs.

Step 1. Print out the lyrics of one of the

Step 3. Go to Padlet board.

So, you get to the website where you can click on each word, then listen and repeat these words, and then check how many you got right.
