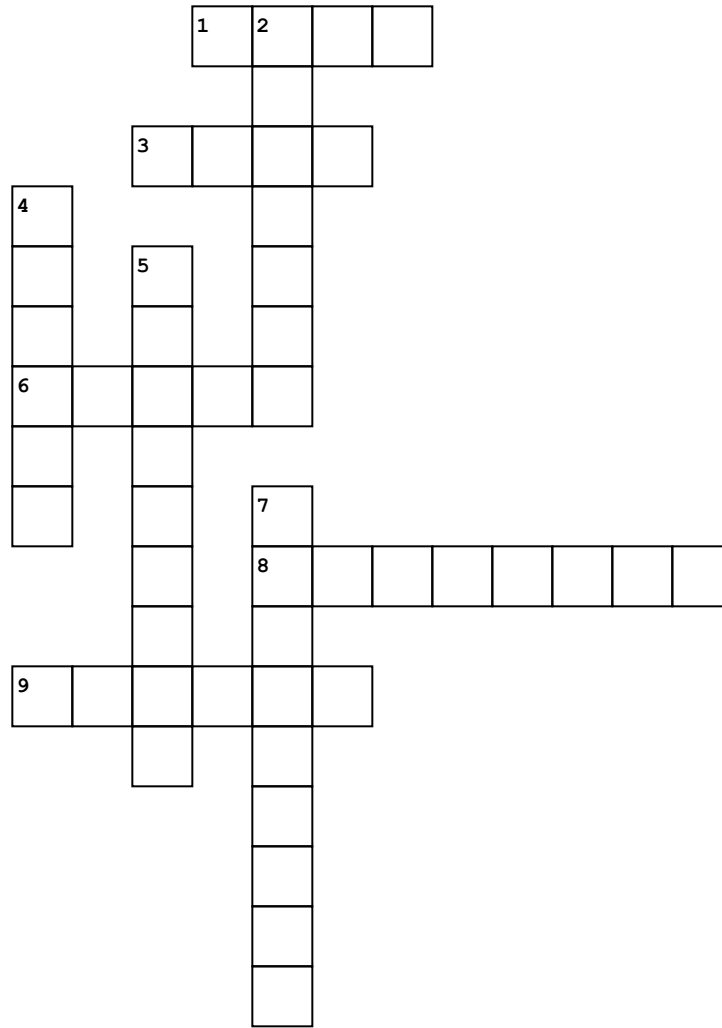


Olaf's Frozen Adventure
